Grants Received by Crest USD 479 in 2023-2024

Our district would like to send a special thank you to the following entities for their support of our district via a competitive grant process.

Throckmorton-Riser Foundation

The Throckmorton–Riser Foundation has been very supportive of Career and Technical Education at Crest. The Foundation supports Crest students in their pursuit of postsecondary certification in the areas of automotive technology, welding, CNA pursuits, as well as HVAC technician training. This year the Throckmorton–Riser Foundation sponsored eight automotive technology students by offsetting the costs of tuition, books, uniforms, and transportation! The Throckmorton–Riser Foundation also supported the district with a \$20,000 upgrade to our weightlifting and physical education program via safer equipment for the students to use.

Goppert Foundation

The Goppert Foundation has been a tremendous ally for our community and school! Just five years ago, the Goppert Foundation donated \$80,000 to our Agriculture program via facilities and providing upgraded technology and equipment to the program. They have funded countless opportunities in the communities where a GSSB location exists.

This year the Goppert Foundation has elected to provide matching funding for a project to improve our outdoor facilities with ADA accessible bleachers, a storage building that will also function as outdoor concession and bathroom facilities, as well as track improvements. On December 19, 2023 The Goppert Foundation delivered the Crest Education Foundation a check for \$120,000. This was the first installment of a \$350,000 matching grant towards improving our outdoor facilities over the next three years. These upgrades would not be possible without their support! We would also like to extend a special thank you to the Crest Education Foundation for the work they do that allows the district to pursue grants and charitable donations. Patterson Foundation

This fall the Patterson Foundation provided the district with two unique opportunities! First, the Patterson Foundation provided a \$54,000 grant toward increasing the technology available in our Career and Technical Education Pathways. Our students in agriculture, culinary arts, business / finance, early childhood education, and marketing pathways will enjoy improvements to the programs and the opportunities available within their respective pathways. Additionally, to invest in our community, district, and staff, the Patterson Foundation provided a \$175,000 grant towards a community / school partnership to provide additional daycare opportunities to our community. The staff of Crest USD 479 will benefit by having a daycare close to the school and off-site yet located within the community. Working families within the community will also benefit from the additional daycare availability.




